



IRATA ROPED ACCESS TRAINING GENERAL INFORMATION SHEET

About the programme

IRATA certified programmes are intensive 5-day courses designed to ensure technicians are competent to perform a full range of rope access tasks from technician to supervisor.

The Level 1 programme covers the following:

- *Pre-visual and tactile personal equipment checks*
- *Basic rope access and fall arrest drills*
- *Rigging and hauling techniques*
- *Rescue protocols*
- *Application of height related health and safety legislation*

Level 2 and 3 programmes include more advanced rigging and rescue techniques coupled with risk assessments, equipment inspection and method statements. More information concerning the content of Level 2 and 3 programmes can be found in the IRATA Guidelines. **If you are applying for a Level 2 or 3 then please ensure you have completed the requisite number of hours underwritten by a fully completed log book. Level 3s will also require a valid First Aid certificate which includes evidence of Basic Life Support.**

Assessment is undertaken on Day 5 by a qualified and independent IRATA Assessor. Where possible, we inform students of their assessor in their Joining Instructions.

Re-Qualification

Re-qualification criteria has recently changed, so please contact RIG Systems for clarification if your current IRATA qualification has or is about to lapse.

Direct Entry

IRATA have recently revised their Direct Entry Guidelines which are the procedures for experienced unqualified roped access technicians to bypass sections of the training syllabus. There are now only very few circumstances when Direct Entry is permitted. For more information please call RIG or review the IRATA website www.irata.org.

Timings

Our programmes start promptly at 0900 and finish at 1700. The course is extremely intensive and there are very strict guidelines concerning the minimum number of guided learning hours. Students sitting the 5 day programme should expect a minimum of 40 hours of training and assessment in order to fulfil these stipulations.

Training Facilities

The course will be delivered at The Eden Project, St Austell, Cornwall. However, we are able to deliver courses at a number of alternative venues, if you have a number of delegates and would like to book a closed course.

Our facility has onsite parking, a cafeteria, welfare facilities and local accommodation. As soon as you select the date of the course you wish to attend, you will be sent Joining Instructions which outline more course specific information.

Clothing

Students are advised to bring the following Clothing:

- Waterproofs
- Outdoor long trousers / lightweight boiler suit
- Suitable stout outdoor footwear
- Old polo shirts
- Warm loose fitting mid layer
- Notebook and pen

Equipment

All equipment is supplied to students attending the Level 1 course and students are given the opportunity to purchase personal rigs at trade prices. Level 2s and 3s are expected to bring their own personal equipment alongside a completed thorough examination logbook with certificates of conformity.

Fitness

All IRATA programmes are physically arduous and students must have a reasonable degree of fitness prior to attendance. There is an element of manual handling and candidates with pre-existing medical conditions that may be aggravated by load lifting are advised to seek further advice from their GP. A certificate of medical fitness and understanding of risk must be signed by all participants prior to taking part in all practical sessions.

Costings

The full 5 day programme costs £630 plus vat and the 3 day requalification/refresher course costs £465 plus vat.

The course cost includes training fees, equipment hire, assessment fees, certification fees, IRATA documentation, log book and ID card. This fee must be paid in full prior to the start of the course unless you hold a credit account. Non-accounts holders should reserve their place on the programme with a non-refundable deposit of £100 made payable to Rig Systems Ltd and send to:
